






Our regional reunions brought together our community, fostering connections and engagement around our shared purpose of student welfare and community building.

The **GOSUMEC Foundation USA Scholarships** have been established with the primary goal of supporting students at our alma mater.



Professional Services - Funded by our team's operations fund, covering Givebutter Plus, MemoryFox, pro bono legal counsel (Manohar Reddy), reduced-fee financial advising (Dr. David Graham), and accounting expenses.

I am thrilled to share the remarkable achievements and progress of GOSUMEC Foundation USA during its second year of operation in 2024. Guided by our mission to enhance student welfare and foster community building, we have made significant strides, thanks to your unwavering support.

As we build on our mission to enhance student welfare and cultivate a strong sense of community, we can celebrate the strides we have made together.

Milestones and Achievements

1. Student Support and Opportunities

- You Supported, 49 students including 39 MBBS students, additional 7 received funding in Jan 2025:
 - 23 first-year MBBS students from the 2024 cohort, additional 7 received funding in Jan 2025
 - 16 second-year MBBS students from the 2023 cohort.
- You Assisted 21 Under Graduate **Therapists and Technicians**, including 9 from the United States & 12 from our relationships in India.
- You Helped 1 **Post Graduate Therapist** with housing support.
- You Created 10 **US Observership and Internship** Opportunities, for aspiring medical professionals.
- You supported **co-curricular student activities**, including sports programs and the publication of their annual magazine.
- Since inception you have created a total of 85 scholarships to MBBS,
 Therapists & Technicians students.

2. Community Growth

- Our community expanded from a gathering of 25 GOSUMEC alumni in Fremont in April 2023 to **over 550 members across the United States.**
- Our website attracted over **50,000 visits in 2024**, reflecting growing engagement and interest in our initiatives.



3. Strengthening Our Scholarship Program

- We are proud to announce that thanks to your support of GOSUMEC Foundation USA, Seth G.S. Medical College & K.E.M. Hospital is the first medical school in India with an endowment positioned to fund nearly all need- and merit-based students for generations to come.
- Our Student Corpus has grown to **\$1 million**, ensuring a lasting legacy of support for medical education with projections to cross \$3 Million by 2032.

Financial Overview: Review of Accounts for 2024

Key Financial Highlights

- Legacy & Community Corpus Donations: \$689,124
- **Total Revenue** for 2024: \$733,685, including \$11,524 from revenue-neutral reunions & \$26,721 investment income, with \$17,751 as realized gains from dividend & interest income & \$8969 as unrealized gains on ETFs. Total revenue, excluding unrealized gains, was \$724,715.
- Western US Therapists: Raised \$3,316 toward their \$6,000 goal to support one Occupational Therapy (OT) and one Physical Therapy (PT) student.
- **Board Contributions:** \$3,000 towards the Operational Account. Archana and I personally covered all expenses related to the website, portal, and media communications, ensuring 100% of your donations go directly to the Student Corpus (Legacy & Community).

Disbursements and Allocations

- \$50,000 transferred for student scholarships and co-curricular activities.
- \$10,000 allocated for designer fees for the Boys' Common Room project.
- \$10,219 expenses for reunions
- \$389,092.35 carried forward from 2023.

Year-End Financial Position

- Total Assets: \$1,052,088
- Includes \$51,001.87 in the D.R. SarDesai Humanities Corpus.

- **Recurring Donors**: 14 donors contributing monthly & 1 quarterly ranging from \$50 to \$250.

- **Scaling the Success**: By fostering regional leadership and engagement, this successful model can be replicated across the rest of the country to amplify our impact nationwide.
- **Building Connections**: We successfully engaged 203 GOSUMECs nationwide through reunions and active participation in our campaigns, strengthening our community and shared mission.



A Game-Changing Partnership: Foundation For Excellence

Our partnership with the Foundation For Excellence (FFE) was inspired by a pivotal dinner meeting between Dr. Sindhu and Avi Nash with Drs. Dilip and Sonali Jeste. During this gathering, Archana and I discussed the GOSUMEC Foundation USA scholarships. Avi suggested a "Pay It Forward" model to sustain and expand our initiative, while we emphasized the importance of building a strong community.

Research introduced us to **Loma Linda University**'s Pay It Forward Scholarship and then to **Prabhu & Poonam Goel, Founders of FFE**, whom Archana knew from her time as President of AAPIO (Association of Physicians of Indian Origin) in the Bay Area. This led us to connect with FFE, and we are delighted by the resulting partnership.

FFE's **exceptional administration** ensures that your hard-earned dollars go directly into students' bank accounts, following rigorous scrutiny of **eligibility** criteria and verification of financial backgrounds.

Over its **30-year history**, *FFE has awarded* over **100,000 scholarships** with a cumulative support of over **\$50 million**. In 2023-2024 alone, FFE reviewed over 32,000 applications and granted over 16,000 scholarships to deserving engineering and medical students.

This partnership not only enhances the impact of your contributions but also allows FFE to leverage the growing GOSUMEC community for mentorship initiatives—amplifying the results far beyond financial donations.

Archana and I are personally committed to championing FFE's cause with other medical colleges, extending its reach beyond GOSUMEC Foundation USA.



Innovative Giving Models: Expanding Support for MBBS Students

As a student of nonprofit strategies, I gained valuable insights from **Dana Snyder**'s book *The Monthly Giving Mastermind* on building, growing, and sustaining support. Inspired by her wisdom, we introduced Legacy Scholarships—an initiative designed to create a lasting impact.

Initially, we crafted a \$100,000 endowment model, where each Legacy Scholarship supports one new MBBS student annually, benefitting five students each year when fully funded.

This is achieved through **five-year pledges of \$20,000 each**, with a 5% annual draw providing \$5,000 to support five students with \$1,000 annually over their five-year course.

The response was **phenomenal**: we established 15 Legacy Scholarships within weeks, including one from India through a connection of Dr. Gajanan Shanbhag.

Additionally, a commitment from our mentors Dr. Sindhu & Avi Nash to support a new MBBS student each year for 15 years.

Expanding Accessibility: Mini Legacy Scholarships

Following a discussion with Anil Kumar from FFE, we introduced **Mini Legacy Scholarships**—a scaled-down version of the Legacy model.

With a **\$20,000 endowment** (either as a one-time gift or spread over up to a decade), a Mini Legacy Scholarship supports *one MBBS student annually for generations, cycling to a new student after every five years.*

This initiative resonated widely, resulting in the establishment of **32 Mini Legacy Scholarships.**

With student support needs exceeding expectations at 12% of the class, we will expand in 2025 to support 6 more students annually through **4 Legacy and 10 Mini Legacy** Scholarships.



Honoring Legacies: A Timeless Tribute Through Named Scholarships

The Legacy Scholarships, named perpetual scholarships established in honor of yourself or a loved one, embody a lasting tribute to your emotional connection with GOSUMEC, resonating across generations.

Personally, I was profoundly moved when I named scholarships to honor my father, grandmother and paternal uncles, whose guidance shaped my journey. The act of naming holds a unique power—it fosters a deep sense of gratitude, legacy, and remembrance. For readers, this is a remarkable way to create an enduring legacy while honoring cherished relationships.

Empowering Donors Through Monthly Giving

In 2024, we launched the **Angels-for-Students Monthly Giving Program**, enabling supporters to make smaller recurring contributions of \$50, \$100, or an amount of their choosing. Monthly giving offers a steady financial stream and fosters deeper connections with the nonprofit, encouraging volunteership, community-building efforts, and exponential impact.

Our goal for 2025 is to expand this program, inviting all donors who are not yet Legacy Scholarship supporters to consider joining as monthly contributors. Research shows that **88% of nonprofit support often comes from just 12% of donors**, and we aim to engage the remaining 90% of GOSUMEC alumni with this convenient and impactful model. Supporters can choose to contribute as:

• Builders: \$50/month

• Sustainers: \$100/month

• Or at a level aligned with their passion and budget.

The Legacy program, along with Mini Legacy Scholarships and our Monthly Giving-Angels, shifts the focus from continuously acquiring new donors to nurturing deeper relationships with existing ones. This approach establishes a reliable, consistent stream of support that sustains our mission month after month. Research shows that recurring givers are not only passionate supporters but often volunteers as well, amplifying the nonprofit's impact and fostering a more engaged community.

Sustained and One-Time Giving

We also continued welcoming one-time and annual contributions, which remain a vital part of our fundraising efforts. Together, these initiatives ensure enduring impact, expanding opportunities for MBBS students while strengthening the bonds within our GOSUMEC community.

Convenient and Tax-Smart Ways to Give

Donors in 2024 enjoyed the convenience of multiple options for contributing to GOSUMEC Foundation USA, including credit cards (Apple Pay and Google Pay included), Zelle, and checks. Among these, three major funding sources stood out for their flexibility and tax benefits:

1. Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs)

- A highly effective option for GOSUMECs aged 70½ and older, QCDs allow donations directly from IRAs to count toward Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs).
- This approach reduces taxable income, saving donors significant amounts on taxes and surcharges—a smarter way to give while maximizing the impact of each dollar.

2. Donor-Advised Funds (DAFs)

- DAFs enable donors to establish a dedicated charitable account, providing flexibility in funding and grant timing, as well as potential investment growth.
- Think of it as an investment account for philanthropy, offering convenience and the opportunity to align giving with your long-term goals.

3. Stock or Equity Transfers

- Donations of appreciated stocks allow donors to avoid capital gains taxes while supporting our mission. This tax-efficient method amplifies the impact of your gift by embedding savings directly into the donation.
- Archana and I personally utilized this method, contributing over \$50,000 through appreciated stock donations—a powerful way to turn gains into meaningful support.

Financial Transparency and Resilience

At GOSUMEC Foundation USA, we take great care in managing your funds to ensure long-term sustainability. Our **Investment Policy Statement** is structured with a 70/30 allocation:

- 70% in S&P 500 Index ETF (VOO)
- 30% in Cash Equivalents (SNSXX Treasuries)

These investments are overseen by our **financial advisor** and our **Finance Committee**, with an expected return of **6-8%** annually. **A 5% draw** from these funds will support scholarships, while a **Community Corpus** serves as an additional layer of financial resilience.

Strengthening Our Mission Through Strategic Fund Management

Funds from Legacy Donors are directed to the Legacy Corpus, an endowment account managed at Charles Schwab.

Contributions from recurring Monthly Donors and One-Time Donors fuel the Community Corpus, which plays a complementary role by fostering the growth of the Legacy Corpus.

The Community Corpus offers the flexibility to support a larger number of students during years of high applicant demand and fluctuating needs, while also ensuring access to cash equivalents during market volatility, providing stability and resilience in challenging times.



Balancing Sustainability: The Relationship Between Legacy and Community Corpus

We anticipate that your generous contributions will constitute 80-85% of the Legacy Corpus, forming the cornerstone of its impact and sustainability. Meanwhile, your monthly and one-time contributions will contribute 15-20% to the Community Corpus, which provides a safety net during market downturns. This strategy helps us avoid the need to sell equities, allowing us to continue meeting students' fluctuating needs with confidence.

A Monte Carlo analysis of this strategy demonstrates an impressive 70% probability of sustaining the corpus indefinitely, ensuring long-term financial stability and impact.

This thoughtful and structured approach to managing our endowment ensures that GOSUMEC Foundation USA will remain financially resilient, fulfilling our mission to support need & merit MBBS students for generations to come.

Building Our Community

To strengthen our community, we curated unforgettable reunions throughout 2024:

- Bay Area, California: Set against the scenic backdrop of Northern California.
- Chicago, Midwest: A grand reunion showcasing the splendor of the Midwest.
- Hoboken-NJ, Northeast: A charming gathering across from the Manhattan skyline.
- SoCal Reunion: A highly successful and impactful event hosted by Dr. Hasmukh & Nirmala Joshi.
- Minneapolis: A warm and welcoming reunion at the beautiful home of Tushar Vora.

These events were revenue-neutral, ensuring that not a single dollar was taken from your donations. Each event was ticketed or sponsored to foster networking, expand our community, and enhance support for our mission.

Looking ahead, we plan to continue this model in 2025, starting with a now concluded Houston mixer on February 8th, followed by alumni gatherings in California later in the year.



Omnichannel Nonprofit Communication: Expanding Connections

Our omni channel communication strategy has been instrumental in growing awareness and engagement across the GOSUMEC community.

The centerpiece of this strategy is our website, <u>gosumec.org</u>, which garnered over **50,000 visits in 2024**. It serves as a comprehensive hub, offering insights into our history, notable firsts, contributions by legends, and a dedicated page for **Medical Humanities**—now featuring a tribute to **Dr. Sunil Pandya**.

We expanded our social media presence to foster deeper connections:

- WhatsApp Groups: Regional groups in the Western, Eastern, Midwest, and Southern US facilitate local reunions, collaboration, and support.
- **LinkedIn and Facebook**: Our growing accounts connect GOSUMECs globally, fostering professional and social networking opportunities.
- **YouTube Channel**: With nearly 150 videos, we showcase inspiring stories, updates, and educational content, ensuring GOSUMECs worldwide can learn about and engage with our mission.

This multichannel approach ensures that wherever our alumni are, they have access to our vibrant community, news, and opportunities to participate in shaping the future of medical education.

Challenges and Lessons Learned

2024 was not without its challenges. Our Boys' Common Room Project faced significant hurdles when our pre-approved designer was unexpectedly removed from the project.

After fulfilling our obligations to the contractor and designer, we handed the project over to the GSMC team for completion.

This experience reinforced the importance of focusing our efforts where we can make the most impact. As a result, we have decided to avoid future construction projects and concentrate our energy on student scholarships—a decision that has already yielded exceptional results.
