A Message from *the Founder*

"The story of GOSUMEC Foundation USA is ultimately a story about community."

When we began this journey, our goal was straightforward: to ensure that talented medical students at Seth G.S. Medical College & KEM Hospital would not be forced to abandon their dreams because of financial barriers. What we did not anticipate was how quickly our alumni community would come together to support that vision.

In 2025, **116 donors contributed \$1,388,875**, helping establish a rapidly growing scholarship endowment that now stands at \$2.44 million. In 2025 alone, the foundation supported **88 medical scholarships**, including **42 newly selected scholars** — students whose academic excellence places them among the most competitive candidates in all of India.

These are students who have overcome extraordinary financial barriers to pursue their calling in medicine. Their median family income is just \$1,102 per year, yet their academic ranking places them in the top 0.25% of all NEET examinees nationwide.

At the same time, our experience has begun contributing to a broader conversation in the nonprofit sector. Through **The GIVE Study**, we are exploring how small nonprofits can build sustainable philanthropic ecosystems based on relationships, trust, and community engagement rather than traditional fundraising campaigns.

Our findings are reaching nonprofit professionals across the country through GIVING Magazine, Philanthropy.org, Givebutter, MemoryFox, and ongoing podcast and LinkedIn thought leadership.

The progress described in this report belongs to the entire GOSUMEC community. Together, we are building something that will outlast all of us: a permanent endowment supporting future generations of physicians.
